For us gardeners this means checking the temperature routinely, listening for thunder, and dodging rainstorms so we can start the next seasonal garden. July was an off month for MCMG in general, so we had additional garden propagation time and time to ramp up for the fall.

July 7 brought Beau Brodbeck to JAC to speak about Hurricane Resilient Trees to about 30 attendees. His presentation focused on the following key points: challenges to urban forests, why trees fail during storms, factors that contribute to tree resilience, and how to plan and design landscapes for storms in general and wind specifically.

On July 13, 4-H leader Adeline Quintana, in cooperation with the Boys and Girls Clubs of Mobile, local bankers, and MG members, learned about housing expenses, childcare, insurance, automobile purchases, etc., through a program called "Your Money, Your Life." Forty teen attendees left with a new sense of life skills beyond the scope of the latest video game or Tik Tok post.

The Public Information committee held its monthly meeting on July 26 via Zoom. Carol Dorsey updated the group reporting on a grant from AARP for sidewalks to be built at the Mobile Medical Museum, allowing for more inclusive visits to the museum. Carol also reported on the Taylor Park summer program which focused on conflict resolution for school-aged attendees.

The August MCMG meeting was held on August 3 at JAC where the latest Master Gardener of the Month, Mary Townsley (Class 2021), was announced. Congratulations to Mary!

Topping off the August meeting was an excellent Camellia presentation from Forrest Latta. Camellias are an important horticultural asset in Mobile, both historically and economically, due to several early key growers. K. Sawada, Robert Rubal, and Bobby Green, all introducing specimens to Mobile which originated in China and Japan, migrated to Europe, and then to the U.S. for us to enjoy.

Jackie Jenkins, coordinator of new MG mentors and mentees, sent out new intern assignments and plans for the Intern Brunch held on August 4 at JAC. Her team decorated for the brunch, and according to many interns, was enjoyed by all. Jack LeCroy moderated the event, providing an overview to the new interns of upcoming class requirements which started on August 11.

The trail connects the Tea Maze to Magnolia Hill and features a variety of path materials and details designed to engage children and their families in a sensory journey. The interior of our hillside maze will feature a Little Free Library and child-size seating (for future *Story Times in the Maze* beginning this fall). The trail that leads from the Maze towards Magnolia Hill will have a small bridge (worthy of a troll below) and a 20' diameter wooden version of the maze will allow kids to see & experience the design that they navigated in the real tea maze.
